- 1. In mass media, the editors perform many delegated tasks before a news story is finalized and submitted for publication or broadcast. List and explain the responsible tasks that an editor does in a newsroom. (10 Marks).
- 2. Investigative Journalism is a form of journalism which many say is more 'newsworthy' than the everyday news in mass media. For example, the great British newspaper publisher Lord Northcliffe once said: "News is what somebody, somewhere wants to suppress; all the rest is advertising." What is investigative journalism and what are its differences from daily hard and soft news? Explain. (10 Marks).
- **3.** In the newsroom, the editorial section includes may sub-functions. that perform several tasks on the copies of news stories submitted to them by the journalists/reporters. What are some duties and responsibilities of such editorial staff? Explain (10 Marks).
- 4. Interviewing is one technique used by journalists to collect news. However, there are certain basic tactics that the journalists should do or should not do to obtain information from the interviewees'.

What are these 'do's and don'ts? (10 Marks).

Chose only Two/2 of these news headlines from the list given below and write news story to fit each. (20 Marks each).

You are required to write the two (2) news story of less than 350 words. The marking will be based on; giving of proper headlines, news story written in the inverted pyramid format, the content of news items, quotes/attributes.

(1) 'Ten die in car incident.'

- Lae Metro Superintendent Tony says that 10 people were killed in a car accident when the PMV bus were travelling on collided with a semitrailer truck at Lae Top Town, yesterday.
- > Of the 20 passengers in the PMV, 10 people died instantly including the driver.
- ➤ The other 10 were in critical condition and are treated at the emergency ward at Angau General Hospital.
- > Dr Clement Malau of the emergency ward says the injured are slowing recovering.

(2) 'PNG Unitech cancels 2020 Due to Covid-19 Scare'.

- ➤ Unitech Vice Chancellor Dr. Ora Renagi announced yesterday that the administration decided to defer the graduation to a later date in fear of spread of the corona virus.
- > Dr Renagi mentioned that the decision to cancel and defer the graduation was not an isolated decision as this came from the SOE Controller Mr David Manning.
- > The VC further states and assures the general public and concerned stakeholders that the administration will announce for a graduation if situations got better.

(3) 'PM James Marape Engages Investigations Finance Department.'

- ➤ The PM engages CID to investigate into the Finance Department following allegations of misuse of K15m allocated for construction of PNG Unitech's School Dining Hall.
- ➤ The allegation arises following Unitech Vice Chancellor Dr Ora Renagi's follow-up on the submission made to the government.

- When the PM checked with the Department if the funding was ready, the Secretary Dr Kin Ngagan said he already signed and approved the cheque for release.
- > The previous dining hall was burnt down in 2016 during a student unrest.

(4) 'Former Unitech Academic Passes Away.'

- A former Unitech academic has passed on in Bougainville recently.
- ➤ CDS HoD Associate Prof Gary Sali while sending his condolences said that Late Dr Justin Kehatsin served at the department for 20 years until he left in 2017.
- > Dr Kehatsin had earned his PhD in Communication and Development in 2017.
- ➤ Late Kehatsin joined Autonomous Region of Bougainville Government as the Education Secretary.
- > Prof Sali described late Dr Kehatsin as an articulate presenter and mentor.
